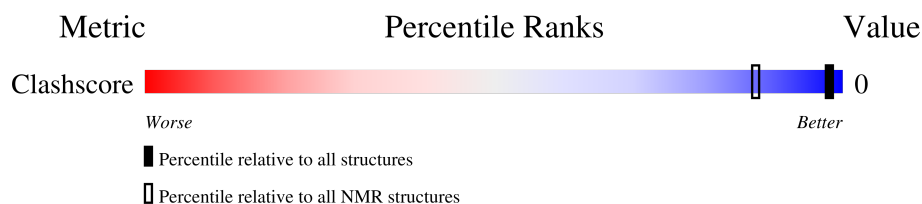
1 Overall quality at a glance

3 Residue-property plots

3.1 Average score per residue in the NMR ensemble

The second graphic shows the sequence where residues are colour-coded according to the number of geometric quality criteria for which they contain at least one outlier: green = 0, yellow = 1, orange = 2 and red = 3 or more. Stretches of 2 or more consecutive residues without any outliers are shown as green connectors. Residues which are classified as ill-defined in the NMR ensemble, are shown in cyan with an underline colour-coded according to the previous scheme. Residues which were present in the experimental sample, but not modelled in the final structure are shown in grey.

The models were refined using the following method: *simulated annealing, molecular dynamics*.

Of the 11 calculated structures, 11 were deposited, based on the following criterion: *model 1 is the average of 10 NMR-determined structures*.

5.1 Standard geometry [i](#)

Bond lengths and bond angles in the following residue types are not validated in this section: 40G, 40T, 40A, NME, ACE, 40C

There are no covalent bond-length or bond-angle outliers.

Chiral center outliers are detected by calculating the chiral volume of a chiral center and verifying if the center is modelled as a planar moiety or with the opposite hand. A planarity outlier is detected by checking planarity of atoms in a peptide group, atoms in a mainchain group or atoms of a sidechain that are expected to be planar.
